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

 Key question: How to help primary care practices implement new evidence-based interventions and models of care?




A few key lessons from our work

- Not all evidence-based interventions work in real life
- There is no such thing as a "one size fits all" intervention
- All types of practices have unique barriers and facilitators to implementing new models of care
- Have to balance adaptation with fidelity
- Practices benefit from practice transformation support, especially practice facilitation, to assist them with change
